**LOCAL AREA COORDINATORS
APPOINTED TO YORKE & MID NORTH**

Baptcare

South Australians with disability will benefit from an investment of more than \$72 million to deliver services under the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS).

Minister for Social Services has announced **Baptcare** and Mission Australia as Community Partners delivering Local Area Coordination (LAC) services in South Australia.

Mission Australia and **Baptcare** will support the implementation of the NDIS at a local community level with services expected to commence from March 2018 for three years.. They will join existing supplier Ferros Care to support an expected 32,300 people with disability in South Australia by 2020.

Baptcare will receive approximately \$24.8 million to deliver LAC Services in the service areas of Eastern Adelaide, Western Adelaide and Yorke Mid North.

Mission Australia will receive approximately \$47.3 million to deliver LAC Services across the service areas of Limestone Coast, Murray and Mallee, Fleurieu and Kangaroo Island, Eyre & Western and Far North, and Southern Adelaide.

What are Local Area Coordinators (LAC's)?

Local Area Coordinators (LACs) are organisations who have partnered with the NDIA to deliver the NDIS. For most people, a Local Area Coordinator or LAC will be your main contact point for the NDIS.

LACs have three key roles:

- They will link you to the NDIS. For a majority of participants, LACs will work with you to develop your plan, help you implement and monitor how your plan is going, and review your progress regularly.
- Link you to information and support in the community and mainstream services such as health and education, and
- Work with their local community to make sure it is more welcoming and inclusive for people with disability.

BEACH ACCESS MAT

On 26 January 2018 the beach access mat was officially opened in front of a large crowd at Solomontown Beach, Port Pirie.

It was seen as such a worthy investment for Port Pirie and its residents and there has been a number of positive comments already from the public via social media and on the day.

The mat was funded through the State Government when they were here for the country cabinet, with great support from Geoff Brock & the Port Pirie Regional Council. The mat in total is 60 metres long and supports a wheelchair, and people requiring walkers.

At this stage Red Cross is waiting for some feedback from relevant providers on what days would be suitable for the mat to be rolled out.

NDIS INFORMATION & UPDATES



THE NDIS MAKES ITS WAY TO REGIONAL SA

From the 1st of January 2018, The NDIS (National Disability Insurance Scheme) has been rolled out across the Flinders Ranges Yorke Peninsula and Mid North Areas.

Marking the beginning of a new chapter of support and choice for disabled Australians living in regional SA.

Demand in the Yorke Mid North NDIS region is estimated to increase from 646 clients accessing disability supports to 1,900 participants at full Scheme, an increase of 194 per cent.

Workforce demand is forecasted to increase to meet the demand, from 175 FTE positions in our region to 725 FTE position at full Scheme (**fourfold increase**). Gap of 550 FTE.

Due to the high level of casualization and part time roles within the sector, the number of roles is expected to be significantly higher, with Direct Care Workers being the highest in demand.

Shaping the Future of SA

Maximising the social and economic benefit of the disability sector

2017 FINAL REPORT

The report consolidates work over recent weeks in the stakeholder workshops and State Forum on the 27th of November and provides some recommendations on next steps for the sector. This has enabled the delivery of a fantastic outcome at our State Forum in helping to transform the disability sector in SA and subsequently the Final Report articulating key findings and actions. PARTICIPANT & PROVIDER PATHWAY

The National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) has designed a new National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) 'pathway'— the experience that participants and providers have from their first interaction to their ongoing engagement with the NDIS. The new NDIS pathway will ensure that participant's and provider's experience with the NDIS is outcomes focused; reliable and trusted; vibrant and connected; and consistent and straightforward. The new NDIS pathway will be progressively piloted and tested over the coming months, before being rolled out nationally. Work is also underway to develop tailored pathways for

people with psychosocial disability, children, people from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities, those from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse backgrounds, and people with more complex needs.

WYATT'S RURAL & REGIONAL YOUTH EDUCATION FUND

RURAL & REGIONAL YOUTH EDUCATION FUND

Wyatt is currently seeking applications for one-off projects, programs and activities that support the retention and re-engagement of children and young people in education in rural and regional South Australia.

WHAT CAN BE FUNDED?

One-off programs and projects situated outside metropolitan Adelaide that assist Wyatt-eligible students to maintain or re-engage with their education. Grant amounts range from \$1,500 to \$7,000 per project.

Applications can be made by schools or organisations (including primary and secondary schools, flexible learning programs and youth services) supporting children and young people experiencing financial disadvantage, specifically through the public education system in South Australia.

The Department for Communities and Social Inclusion (DCSI) has simplified access to four of its grant programs; The Charitable and Social Welfare Fund, Multicultural Celebrating Diversity one-off grants, Volunteer Training grants and Volunteer Support Fund. Grants SA will provide \$3 million of one-off funding to community organisations in 2017-18 to support local projects that strengthen communities across South Australia.

Funds will be distributed through major, medium and minor funding rounds. Major grants of \$20,001 to \$50,000 will be open twice a year, medium grants of \$5,001 to \$20,000 will be open four times a year and minor grants of up to \$5,000 are open all year round and applications close on the last day of every month.
